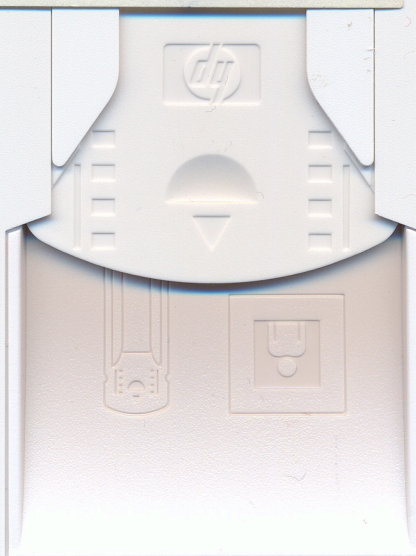
Dear Mr. Bean.
