Thank you very much
for your letter and all the
helpful suggestions, which I hope
you will not mind my including
in my collection.

I am very glad that
you are going to Aemuna again
and will be able to have a
look at the stones. The Greek
one is at the S.W. of the
site, along the path leading to
the western gate. It is just

south of this point, which is marked in
Lanchonishi as a double row of
E.W. running pillars.

I enclose a photo showing the
position of the difficult water
fragments. It was taken from near
the eastern knoll of the colony,
looking west. The blocks in the
foreground are very hard to
miss. The inscription, as far as I
remember, is in the middle
of the pillars in the center of the
photo.

I also enclose a copy of
the 'Cobasa' inscription, poor
though they are. They are cut
high up in bare rock, which is
much pitted.

I hope this does not come
too late for your trip to Armenia.
In any case, good hunting!
